Mark 10:1-52

Division 1: The Pharisees want to debate God’s truth.

Mark 10:1-16

(Additional passages: Philippians 3:5-6; Matthew 23:27-28; Philippians 3:7-9; Mark 3:6; Mark 10:9; Matthew 5:27-28)

Principle #1: You cannot litigate righteousness with God; you can only come to Jesus in childlike faith, trusting that He is able to save you from your sins and make you righteous.

Division 2: A rich young man wants Jesus to recognize his works’ justification.

Mark 10:17-31

(Additional Passages: Deuteronomy 28:12-13; Mark 10:18; Matthew 22:36-40; 1 Corinthians 13:1-3; Mark 10:25; Mark 10:27)

Principle #2: There is nothing we can do to please God, because His request for total surrender is impossible to achieve unless we release ourselves to Him making what is impossible possible.

Division 3: Disciples confusion breeds prideful selfishness to seek authority over others.

Mark 10:32-52
