## The Return to Jerusalem Study Zechariah 9-11; "Messiah, the Shepherd King" DIVISIONS AND PRINCIPLES

## **Division 1:**

Zechariah describes the coming of two kings.

Zechariah 9:1-17

Additional citations: 2 Samuel 7:13; Matthew 21:2-5; Philippians 2:3-5; Ezekiel 36:27; John 12:49; Ephesians 4:15; Ephesians 4:29; Revelation 19

Principle #1: Jesus submitted himself to God's written Word in every way while on earth, and our attitude will be the same, if He is our King.

## **Division 2:**

Zechariah exhorts the Exiles to see God as their Shepherd and Restorer.

Zechariah 10:1-12

Additional citations: Deuteronomy 8:18; Matthew 6:33

Principle #2: God, the Good Shepherd, is the source of everything His flock needs and, since He cares for His flock, He provides what is good for them.

## **Division 3:**

Zechariah describes the coming poetic justice on Israel for rejecting its King and Shepherd. Zechariah 11:1-17

Additional citation: Jeremiah 3:15; Ezekiel 6:36; Matthew 7:15; Matthew 24:24

Principle #3: God will use poetic justice to put in place a false shepherd who will bring eternal judgment on the people who do not value His true shepherds.
