Jesus Teaches Nicodemus

¹ Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council.

Then the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to him with a question.

Acts 23:8

(The Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, and that there are neither angels nor spirits, but the Pharisees acknowledge them all.)

Q3. In a general sense what is "resurrection"?

Matthew 22:29-33 [The Message (MSG)] [In this exchange, Jesus is correcting the Sadducees.]

Jesus answered, "You're off base on two counts: You don't know what God said, and you don't know how God works. At the <u>resurrection</u> we're beyond marriage. As with the angels, all our ecstasies and intimacies then will be with God. And regarding your speculation on whether the dead are raised or not, don't you read your Bibles? The grammar is clear: God says, 'I am — not was — the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob.' The living God defines himself not as the God of dead men, but of the living."

Hearing this exchange, the crowd was much impressed.

"The priesthood lived in luxury well beyond that of the average man. They supported their lavish lifestyles with a temple tax which every Jew was required to pay. The temple taxes combined with taxes imposed by Herod and Rome were literally threatening the existence of the Jewish people. The people of the land were carrying a burden they could scarcely bear or tolerate. . .

"The Pharisees had great zeal for God. The average Pharisee fasted two days a week and paid his tithes to the penny. Yet, their zeal for God did not lead them to God but away from God. They examined the Law to the smallest detail, but they entirely missed what the Law was saying. John tells us that Jesus was God's word made manifest. In other words, He was Torah in the flesh. Yet, the Pharisees stood in the presence of the perfect revelation of Torah, and they did not know Him. In fact, they wanted to kill Him. (To be fair, we cannot say this is true of all the Pharisees. In fact, some later became Jesus' followers.)

"The Law was meant to lead people to love God and their neighbor. Most of all it was meant to lead to Jesus. It is ironic that because the Pharisees [through their example represented] none of these things, they were the most impure of all. Jesus said that if the people's righteousness did not exceed that of the Pharisees, they could not enter the Kingdom of God. . .

"The Sadducees were of the wealthy ruling class in Jesus' day. Many of them comprised the priesthood that controlled the temple in Jerusalem and the Jewish legal council called the Sanhedrin. They were in some ways more conservative than the Pharisees. They only recognized the Torah as the inspired word of God. They acknowledged neither the prophets nor the oral traditions that came after the first five books of the Bible. Consequently, they did not believe in the resurrection or any life after death. They were often at odds with the Pharisees over this matter."

- While the Sadducees "recognized" the first five books of the Bible the Torah to the exclusion of all other books (now known as the Old Testament), Jesus used their beloved Torah to disprove their basic belief that there is <u>no</u> resurrection.
