Q1. If Jesus repeats a phrase or a concept, should we pay attention?

"Unity" is the critical theme in Jesus' prayer and it can be summarized by verses "^{22b} that they may be one as we are one: ²³ I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." In this NIV-1984 translation, excluding the references to Judas Iscariot and Satan, the word "one" is mentioned five times. The phrase – referencing Jesus and The Father – "one as we are one" (or a variation) is repeated twice. The phrase – referencing the Disciples or Believers – "them (or they) may be one" is repeated thrice. As you progress through this StudySheet, note the various references to oneness or unity that Jesus emphasizes.


Q17. Truth? How do you know that a bunch of "made-up" stories are the "Truth"? (This is called 'Apologetics' or defense of your faith)

¹⁰ All I have is yours, and all you have is mine. And glory has come to me through them. ¹¹ I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name -- the name you gave me -- so that they may be one as we are one.

Whom are you mocking? Against whom do you open your mouth wide and stick out your tongue? Are you not <u>children of transgression</u>, the offspring of deceit,

John 17:12 [King James Version (KJV)]

While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy name: those that thou gavest me I have kept, and none of them is lost, but the <u>son of perdition</u>; that the scripture might be fulfilled.

A "son of perdition" is one in whose nature there is the quality expressed by "perdition." The phrase is used in Isaiah 57:4 to express the apostacy of the Israelites (in English version, "children of transgression"). It occurs once again in 2ndThessalonians 2:3, of the "man of sin." (Comp. Notes there.) . . . In the present passage it is difficult to express the meaning in English, because we have no verb of the same root as the abstract substantive "perdition," and no abstract substantive of the same root as the verb "perish." No exact translation can therefore give in English the point of our Lord's words, "And none of them perished except him whose nature it was to perish." ¹⁷ Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.

²⁰ "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message,

Please note that as we study the remainder of Jesus' prayer for all Believers, time seems to condense so that His prayer encompasses Jesus' disciples and all of the people who believed in Him during this time of direct ministry, in addition to all future Believers.

²² I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one:

Q39. What "glory" did Jesus give His disciples? Is the "glory" something that we can sense (see, hear, smell, touch, or taste)?

Here, as all through this Intercessory Prayer, the future which immediately grows out of the present is regarded as present; the fulness of the glory which awaits Him at His Father's right hand is thought of as already given to Him; and the believers who have become, and will become, one with Him, to whom He has given eternal life (John 17:2 \uparrow), are thought of as <u>sharers in it</u>. It is the thought which is expanded by St. Paul when he speaks of the children being "heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if we suffer with Him to the end that we may be also glorified with Him" (Romans 8:17 \downarrow); and by St. John when he speaks of "children of God being like Him because we shall see Him as He
